## How to download the PDF registration certificate from eSearch plus

The certificate can be found online at https://euipo.europa.eu/eSearch/#basic. Enter the abovementioned EUTM registration number and click on 'Search'. Then click on the EUTM name (in blue) to open the page giving detailed information about the EUTM. Look for the section called 'Correspondence', further down the page, and in the 'Search' field type 'Certificate of Registration'. Then click on the icon in the 'Actions' column on the right-hand side to download the certificate.

A message will then appear, asking you to log in if you have not already done so. If you do not have an account, you will be asked to sign up in order to create one.
